WHERE CULTURE & COMMUNITY MEET

CVPD outreach team three weeks ago to discuss strategies that the Association could potentially implement to deter encampments in downtown.

Dominic shared that the meeting was helpful but also pointed out the limitations of CVPD.

Dominic shared the importance for business and property owners to have a No Trespass Authorization Letter submitted with CVPD.

Dominic offered to provide the information to Committee members that have not submitted a letter with CVPD.

Dominic reported that he will be following up with code enforcement with National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) and the massage parlor at 299 Third Avenue.

Dr. Gonzalo Quintero shared that he reached out to the Veteran Affairs office on H Street for their consideration to provide outreach to the homeless veterans but was told that office work on assigned case management.

City of Chula Vista Police, Lieutenant Ernie Pinedo, Department of the Homeless Outreach Team presented to the Committee.

- Lt. Pinedo reported that there are three new officers added to the Outreach Team.
- Lt. Pinedo announced that Officer Taylor Cate will be the assigned liaison for the District.
- Lt. Pinedo reported that although there is shelter availability for the homeless, the homeless are reluctant to receive services.
- Lt. Pinedo reported that staff is currently working on a possible safe camping and safe parking programs potential options in Chula Vista like the programs in San Diego and are currently touring tentative sites for these programs.
- Lt. Pinedo admitted an increase in the homeless population in Chula Vista after the implementation

of the homeless ban in San Diego. Joe Raso asked if Lt. Pinedo's input is well received with the City of Chula Vista. Lt. Pinedo admitted that City Council was receptive to any recommendations when he presented but there continues to be internal challenges. Lt. Pinedo reported that 3% of the homeless population in Chula Vista have been removed off the streets through the city's Family Reunification Program. Lt. Pinedo shared that he will formally introduce Dominic to Officer Taylor Cate. Dominic thanked Lt. Pinedo for his time. 4.b. Downtown 4.b. No action taken. 4.b. Dominic reported that the new maintenance Maintenance staff member, Omar, is working out very well and **Operations:** has passed his 60-day probationary period. **Update** Dominic reported that staff will be looking into purchasing a new pressure washer for the maintenance department as the pressure washer is no longer repairable due to its age and the high repair costs. Dominic added that the maintenance crew perform intermittent spot cleaning throughout the District until the professional quarterly power washes. Joe Raso asked again about the ongoing landscaping issues of, "you design it, you maintain it." Dominic mentioned that part of the Expansion Process would be a thorough review of all governing documents of the Association with the City of Chula Vista. Dominic added at this time of expansion the Board of Directors will be able to negotiate responsibilities on Third Avenue.
